**RECESS ADMONISHMENT**

- (4) make any investigation, test a theory of the case, recreate any aspect of the case, conduct any experiments, or in any other way investigate or learn about the case on your own; or**
- (5) form or express any opinion on any subject connected with the trial until the case is submitted to you for deliberation. (See NRS 175.401, *Bowman v. State*, 132 Nev. A.O. 30)**

**OVERNIGHT ADMONISHMENT**

**Court: Ladies and gentlemen, we are going to take our overnight recess. You are admonished not to:**

- (1) talk or converse among yourselves or communicate with anyone else on any subject connected with this trial either by phone, email, text, internet or other means;**
- (2) read, watch or listen to any news or media accounts or commentary about the trial, including, without limitations, newspapers, television, radio and internet;**
- (3) do any independent research, such as consulting dictionaries, using the internet, or using reference materials;**
- (4) make any investigation, test a theory of the case, recreate any aspect of the case, conduct any experiments, or in any other way investigate or learn about the case on your own; or**
