PETITION

COMES NOW the Honorable James W. Hardesty, Associate Justice of the Nevada Supreme Court, and petitions the Nevada Supreme Court on its administrative docket to consider adoption of a statewide requirement that all judges utilize a validated risk assessment tool for use in pretrial decision-making as recommended by the Committee to Study Evidence-Based Pretrial Release. In support of the petition, petitioner asserts that:

- 1. The Committee to Study Evidence-Based Pretrial Release was created by Resolution of the Judicial Council of the State of Nevada in 2015. Justice James W. Hardesty chairs the Committee; membership is comprised of rural and urban judges, public defenders, district attorneys, pretrial services representatives, county representatives and a representative from Boyd School of Law. The Committee was charged with studying the process for pretrial release under NRS 178.484 and NRS 178.4853.
- 2. Since its inception, the Committee has held fourteen meetings. The Committee has received presentations from pretrial release experts from the Pretrial Justice Institute; the State of Kentucky Administrative Office of the Courts and Department of Pretrial Services; the Arizona Supreme Court; the U.S. District Court, District of Nevada; the University of Cincinnati; the National Institute of Corrections; the JFA Institute; and the Department of Justice, OJP Diagnostic Center. In addition, the Committee has also heard presentations from the Nevada Bail Agents Association and the American Bail Coalition.

- 3. The Committee to Study Evidence-Based Pretrial Release launched its pilot site program on September 1, 2016, using a Nevada-specific risk assessment tool (Nevada Pretrial Risk Assessment or NPRA) developed and validated by Dr. James Austin with the JFA Institute. Prior to commencing the pilot program, the NPRA Implementation Subcommittee was convened to develop the pilot site manual and to provide pilot site stakeholders with necessary training. Participating pilot sites included Washoe County District Court, Washoe County Justice Court, Reno Municipal Court, Sparks Municipal Court, Clark County District Court, Las Vegas Justice Court, Las Vegas Municipal Court, and White Pine Justice Court. Since the commencement of the pilot program, courts in Douglas and Churchill Counties have implemented and used the NPRA. Since the inception of the pilot sites and has made changes to the program and the NPRA tool as necessary.
- 4. On August 15, 2018, the Committee's efforts culminated in a special meeting during which the Committee unanimously voted to recommend that the Nevada Supreme Court enter an order requiring the use of a validated, pretrial risk assessment tool on a statewide basis for use in pretrial release decisions in the form of Exhibit A or B attached to this Petition.
- 5. Following the Committee's action, Justice Hardesty attended a Nevada Association of Counties (NACO) Board meeting. During this meeting, the NACO Board approved a motion ". . . indicating the Board's support for the implementation of a validated pretrial risk assessment tool on a statewide basis, and to request that, if the Supreme Court mandates the use of such a tool, they: 1) allow counties latitude in implementing the tool; and 2) gather additional information on potential budgetary and staffing impacts from implementation so that counties can adequately prepare to use the tool."

Accordingly, petitioner requests that the Nevada Supreme Court place this matter on its administrative docket, hold such hearings as it deems necessary, and consider the Committee to Study Evidence-Based Pretrial Release's recommendation to require all judges to use a validated risk assessment tool in the form of either Exhibit A or B in making pretrial release decisions under NRS 178.484 and NRS 178.4853.
