Call to Order, Call of the Roll and Determination of Quorum Status

Chief Justice Gibbons, Chair of the Judicial Council of the State of Nevada (JCSN) Full Council, called the meeting to order at 1:36 p.m. A quorum was declared present.

Public Comment

There was no public comment.

Approval of Meeting Summary from the November 30, 2018, meeting

Chair Gibbons called for discussion and with there being none, the meeting summary for the November 30, 2018, meeting was approved.

CHAIR GIBBONS MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE MEETING SUMMARY OF THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL OF THE STATE OF NEVADA FULL COUNCIL MEETING HELD NOVEMBER 30, 2018. THE MOTION WAS SECONDED AND PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

<u>Update – 2019 Legislative Session</u>

Justice Hardesty reported the following:

<u>AB43</u> – Increases the number of district judges in certain judicial districts. He reported that this bill increases the number of judges in the Second, Fourth, and Eighth Judicial Districts.

AB46 - Increases the annual base salary for certain justices and judges. He reported that the bill is currently in Assembly Ways and Means. Justice Hardesty noted that any action on this bill will be deferred until after the Economic Forum which meets May 1, 2019. He reported that the Legislators want to explore different alternatives to judicial pay raises therefore he requested the Supreme Court's Human Resource department to conduct a demographics research project on all district court judges in the State. He noted the identifying factors are when judges entered the system and the status of longevity pay. Justice Hardesty reported that the research project is an acknowledgement of who is currently receiving longevity pay and the amount they are receiving. He emphasized that this might have an impact on longevity pay for new judges starting after the 2020 election. He reported that this would not impact incumbents who are re-elected.

<u>AB80 – Makes various changes relating to the Nevada Sentencing Commission.</u> He reported that this bill is in regards to recommendations from the Sentencing Commission. He noted that the recommendations are primarily regarding data collection.

AB236 – Makes various changes related to criminal law and criminal procedure. He reported that this bill makes the most historic set of changes to Nevada's criminal justice system in a very long time. He reported that this bill is a result of the work of the Advisory Commission on Administration of Justice (ACAJ) during the interim. Justice Hardesty reported that there is a report filed at the Legislature dated January 2019, noting the 25 recommendations from the ACAJ. He said the report identifies changes to Nevada's criminal justice code system, filings, and major sentence structures involving theft, habitual criminal, burglary, and drug trafficking just to name a few. Justice Hardesty noted one of the recommendations is additional funding for Specialty Courts. He reported within the Governor's budget is additional funding in the amount of \$6M for specialty courts.

<u>AB222</u> – Revises provisions relating to specialty courts. He reported that this bill pertains to the eligibility for assignment to a specialty court program. Justice Hardesty noted that the approach this bills takes is to have most defendants placed in a diversion program not place them on probation.

Judge Steve Dobrescu reported a concern with AB222 noting the practicality of revoking a defendant from the program. His concern is a defendant is not always revoked for a technical violation. He noted that

revoking someone from the program is a graduated sanctioning process and sometimes you revoke them for non-compliance not because they got a new charge. Judge Dobrescu thought the definition of technical violation should be expanded to say, a non-technical violation is a new felony, new gross misdemeanor, or a determination from a specialty court.

Chief Judge Linda Bell reported that she shares the same concerns as Judge Dobrescu and noted that in Clark County they accept defendants with substantial harm to a protected person in their mental health and veteran's treatment court. She noted that is very common to accept defendants with those types of violations in Clark County. Chief Judge Bell reported that when a defendant has been unsuccessful in a specialty court they are required to give them three more chances before we terminate them from probation.

Justice Hardesty reported that this bill is intended to do exactly the opposite. He noted it is intended to divert those with mental health problems even those who commit crimes that are outside the definition of a violent offender. He noted a person has mental health problems and commits burglary that isn't a burglary with a deadly weapon or burglary that involves harm to an individual or victim is going to be eligible for consideration of diversion.

Mr. John McCormick reported on the following bills:

Supreme Court Bills:

<u>AB9</u> – Revises provisions governing justice court. He reported that this bill was heard on February passed by Assembly Judiciary as introduced on March 1, 2019.

<u>AB14 – Revises provisions governing court orders for protection when certain children are involved.</u> He reported that this bill was heard on February 13, 2019, in Assembly Judiciary.

<u>AB17 – Revises provisions governing bail in criminal cases.</u> He reported that this bill was amend, and do pass as amended in Senate Judiciary on March 15, 2019.

<u>AB20 – Revises provisions governing judicial discipline.</u> He reported that this bill is scheduled to be heard on March 27, 2019, in Assembly Judiciary. He noted that the Director of Judicial Discipline has not been receptive to any outreach the limited jurisdiction judges have undertaken.

SB5 – Revises provisions relating to court rules of practice and procedure.

SB6 – Makes various changes <u>relating to courts</u>.

He reported that these bills were bills will probably not be heard or moved.

<u>SB20 – Revises provisions relating to guardianships.</u> He reported that this bill makes a number of changes to guardianship. He reported that Justice Hardesty presented the bill with a fairly substantial amendment and there was no opposition.

Chair Gibbons reported that there is a case pending in the Supreme Court called *Tobiasson vs. Nevada Commission on Judicial Discipline*. He noted that the case has been set for oral argument on April 2, and can be streamed live. He noted this case raises a lot of issues regarding the discipline process and may be of interest to the judges.

SB74 – Revises provisions governing eviction actions. He reported that this bill was passed by the Senate Judiciary with an amendment. He noted that this bill deals with the time to appeal an eviction and that we had initially proposed 5 days and the Committee changed that to 10 days. Mr. McCormick reported that the 10 judicial day period is also reflected in SB151 which changes the time frame for eviction actions so the 10 judicial day period is consistent.

Other Bills of Interest:

- AB53 Revises provisions governing the issuance and revocation of drivers' licenses, instruction permits and privileges to drive by the Department of Motor Vehicles. He reported that this bill will potentially correct some of the issues relating to the mandatory interlock statute from the 2015 Legislative Session. He noted this bill will be heard on March 21, 2019, in Assembly Growth and Infrastructure.
- <u>AB81 Makes various changes relating to the oversight and provision of legal representation of indigent defendants in criminal cases.</u> He reported that this bill was heard on Tuesday, March 12, 2019. He noted that this bill has a \$15M appropriation to help counties pay for indigent defense services.
- <u>AB125 Revises provisions governing bail in certain criminal cases.</u> He reported that at this time a hearing has not been scheduled. He noted that this bill is part of a bail reform package.
- <u>AB211 Makes various changes concerning domestic relations</u>. He reported that this bill requires the State Court Administrator to oversee all child custody exchanges in the State of Nevada, creates a citizen review panel for all family court decisions as well as numerous other things. He noted there are numerous fiscal notes on the bill.
- <u>SB38 Makes various changes relating to the practice of court reporting, the practice of court recording and the practice of court transcribing.</u> He reported that this bill relates to certifying individuals who turn on the audio recording system in the courts. He noted that this bill was re-referred to Senate Judiciary.
- SB149 Makes an appropriation to assist with the construction of a new courthouse in White Pine County. He reported that a hearing has not been scheduled.
- <u>SB151 Revises provisions related to certain proceedings concerning property.</u> He reported that this bill was heard on March 12, 2019, in Senate Judiciary.
- <u>SJR2 Proposes an amendment to the Nevada Constitution that revises the provisions governing appointments of judicial officers to fill vacancies.</u> He reported that this resolution is a constitutional amendment that would make a number of changes to the judicial selection committee including increasing the number of attorney members, decreasing the number of lay members and also making the application process more confidential. He noted that a hearing has not been scheduled.
- <u>SJR5 Proposes to amend the Nevada Constitution to revise provisions relating to the State Legislature.</u> He reported that this resolution would create annual Legislative sessions specifically 90 day in odd number years and 60 days in even number years. He noted that a hearing has not been scheduled.
- <u>AB192</u> Establishes a procedure when certain offenses are decriminalized. He reported that this bill as introduced will create a significate issue in terms of record sealing. He noted it requires the central repository to go through and find all records of criminal history where a person was convicted of a crime

that is no longer considered a crime and then notify every criminal justice agency and request they destroy the records. Mr. McCormick reported that the bill is scheduled for a hearing on March 19, 2019.

<u>AB110 – Revises provisions relating to minor traffic and related violations.</u> He reported that this bill is from the Interim Committee to Study the Feasibility and Advisability of Converting Certain Traffic Misdemeanors into Civil Infractions. He noted that this bill creates some permissive language regarding online plea process in misdemeanor traffic citations. Mr. McCormick reported the bill was heard on March 15, in Assembly Judiciary.

<u>AB80 – Makes various changes relating to the Nevada Sentencing Commission.</u> He reported that this bill was amend and do pass on March 15, 2019, in Assembly Judiciary.

<u>AB265 – Revises provisions governing mental health.</u> He reported that this bill would require the Department of Public Safety (DPS) repository to do outreach to all courts to ensure they are conforming with the statutory obligation of submitting mental health records to the repository. He noted that this bill also requires DPS to submit a report to the Governor and Legislature.

<u>SB277 – Revises provisions relating to the support of children.</u> He reported that this bill changes aspects of how gross monthly income is calculated for setting child support payments.

Chief Judge Scott Freeman asked about <u>SJR2</u> which proposes an amendment to the Nevada Constitution that revises the provisions governing appointments of judicial officers to fill vacancies. Chair Gibbons reported that he and a few others met with Senator Pickard who is the sponsor of the bill. He noted that Senator Pickard said he has received feedback from family attorneys saying that the Judicial Selection Commission has not submitted names of people who have sufficient experience in family law for consideration by the Governor, therefore he thought it would be better to have additional members from the State Bar serve on the committee. Chair Gibbons noted the bill also makes the entire application confidential so that would be a transparency issue.

Resolution to support SB149

Judge Dobrescu reported on $\underline{SB149}$, which makes an appropriation to assist with the construction of a new courthouse in White Pine County. Judge Dobrescu noted that the county has some funding but is in need of additional funds to construct the courthouse.

CHAIR GIBBONS MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT SENATE BILL 149. THE MOTION WAS SECONDED AND PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

Reports of Standing Committees

Court Administration Committee

Ms. Sweet reported the following:

- The courts constructed a poster regarding Marsy's Law for all courts to use.
- Nine Institute for Court Management (ICM) Fellows have been trained as instructors and will serve as instructors for future ICM classes in Nevada.

Court Improvement Program

Mr. McCormick reported that this Committee is continuing to implement the juvenile dependency mediation program and continues to work with the ABA Center for Children and the law on implementing the Every Student Succeeds Act.

Judicial Education Committee

Mr. McCormick reported that the Judicial Education Committee is charged with overseeing and allocating the elective judicial education funding account in the amount of \$150K. He reported that as of February 14, 2019, that account has a balance of \$32,972. He noted that the low balance is due to the State Bar having two annual meetings in one fiscal year.

Language Access Committee

No meeting to report.

Specialty Court Funding Committee

Mr. McCormick reported the following:

- AB29 funds were allocated in December;
- Changing the name AB29 to fee based funding;
- Re-assessing the available funding because it is an administrative assessment funded account and at this time we don't know the impact of Marsy's Law;
- Best practices and standards subcommittee met during the Specialty Court Conference and agreed on a finalize draft of the Nevada Best Practices and Standards for Specialty Courts and that was approved at the last SC Funding Committee meeting and that is available on the website;
- Applications for general funds is due today, March 15 by COB;
- NADCP Conference is scheduled for July 14-17, 2019, in National Harbor, Maryland, and
- The next Specialty Court Funding Committee meeting is scheduled for May 24, 2019.

<u>Technology Committee</u>

No meeting to report.

No meeting to report.

Chief Judge Bell reported that there meeting was brief and centered on the Legislative session.

Judge Tod Young reported they had very good participation and in your meeting materials is a summary of the meeting.

South Central Regional Council

Judge Dobrescu reported that he was not able to attend the meeting due to a trial but the meeting was well attended. He noted one topic that has been on-going is statutory provisions that allows highway patrol to cite traffic citations into an adjoining county even though there is another statute that says they should cite traffic citations into the closest magistrate. Judge Dobrescu mentioned this because it has been an issue for their region and is acknowledging it for some future legislation.

Chief Judge Freeman reported that their meeting is scheduled for March 20.

SUBJECT: Amendment to the JCSN Bylaws, Article XI

Attached hereto please find a proposed amendment to the Judicial Council of the State of Nevada's Bylaws, Article XI governing the membership and duties of the Specialty Court Funding Committee. Pages 18 and 19 of the Bylaws are provided here with the amendatory language, and the entire Bylaws are available upon request.

The proposal includes the addition of three non-voting members to the Committee who are specialty court program coordinators or program administrators. This revision is intended to provide the Committee with expert information and input regarding the operation and administration of programs from those with their feet on the ground.

The three additional changes are intended to make the language in Section 4 gender neutral, to establish the creation of best practices and the monitoring of compliance with criteria and best practices as duties of the Committee, and to specifically provide the Committee with the authority to appoint ad hoc and other subcommittees.

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve the proposed amendment to the JCSN Bylaws as presented.

ARTICLE XI

SPECIALTY COURT FUNDING COMMITTEE

Section 1. Name; Committee Type.

The Specialty Court Funding Committee, hereinafter referred to as the "Committee," shall be a standing committee to the Council.

Section 2. Composition.

The Specialty Court Funding Committee shall consist of no more than [17] 20 members. The Chair and Vice-Chair of the Committee must be Supreme Court Justices. The committee will consist of one general jurisdiction judge and one limited jurisdiction judge from each region except Clark. The Clark Region will have two general jurisdiction judges and two limited jurisdiction judges. Additionally, there will be three at-large members consisting of one general jurisdiction judge, one limited jurisdiction judge, and one judge from any region and jurisdiction. At-large members may be judges who do not conduct a specialty court program, and will be appointed by the Chair and Vice-Chair of the Committee. Judges who currently preside as a specialty court judge will have priority. Senior judges who participate in specialty court activities are eligible to serve on this committee. There will also be three non-voting members who are specialty court program coordinators or program administrators. These members will be selected by the chief justice upon recommendation of the specialty court program coordinators and program administrators in three regions consisting of the Clark Region, the Washoe Region, and the Rural Region which shall be comprised of the all the courts in the Sierra, North Central, and South Central regions. These members will serve terms consistent with those of the other members of the Committee save that the initial terms of the specialty court coordinator or administrator members shall begin July 1, 2019, and the initial three members shall serve from then until December 31, 2019, before commencing regular two year terms on January 1, 2020. The chief justice will officially appoint members upon recommendation of the Regional Councils, and all terms will commence on January 1st of the appointing year and end on December 31st of the last year of the term. The chief justice shall maintain the right to decline recommendations. Members will serve for a term of 2 years. Terms commencing February 10, 2006, will be staggered so approximately half the membership will be appointed each year. Resignation or retirement appointments will be made by a nomination ballot and election within the region.

Section 3. Duties.

The Committee shall establish an application procedure and required documentation for requesting of specialty court funds, develop funding criteria and best practices, develop reporting requirements for recipients who receive funds, collect specialty court data and information to aid in funding, and monitor courts on use of funding and compliance with funding criteria and best practices. The committee, at the discretion of the chair, may appoint ad hoc or other subcommittees necessary to further these duties or improve specialty court programs within this State.

Section 4. Meetings; When Held.

RE: ADKT 0539 – Order Adopting Statewide use of the Nevada Pretrial Risk Assessment

Attached is ADKT 0539, Order Adopting Statewide use of the Nevada Pretrial Risk Assessment. This order was adopted from the Committee to Study Evidence-Based Pretrial Release (Committee). The Committee held multiple meetings, had many presentations from local and national experts on the subject of evidence-based pretrial risk assessment tools. On September 1, 2016, the Committee launched a pilot site program using a Nevada-specific risk assessment tool. The Nevada Pretrial Risk Assessment tool was validated by Dr. Austin of the JFA Institute.

On August 15, 2018, with the results from the pilot program, the Committee unanimously voted to recommend that the Supreme Court enter an order requiring the use of the validated pretrial release assessment tool be used statewide. On December 28, 2018, the Committee chair, Justice James W. Hardesty, filed a petition to adopt a statewide requirement ordering that all judges utilize a validated risk assessment tool in pretrial decision making.

The Nevada Supreme Court determined that the Nevada Pretrial Risk Assessment tool is warranted as it will assist judges in making informed release decisions based on the risk not by whether the defendant can afford to pay bail.

Additionally, the Administrative Office of the Courts was ordered to develop training materials for the implementation and use of the Nevada Pretrial Risk Assessment. Those training materials are expected to be available on the Nevada Appellate Court's website by this fall. Currently, the AOC staff are planning three webinars: one for judges, one for attorneys, and one for the staff person completing the assessment.

The AOC team working on the webinars includes myself, John McCormick, Rick Stefani, David Gordon, and Jamie Gradick. If you have suggestions related to content or presenters, we can discuss them now or you may provide constructive comments to any or all of the team via email.

WHEREAS, in June 2015, the Judicial Council established a Committee to Study Evidence-Based Pretrial Release, whose purpose was to examine the current pretrial release system in Nevada and to consider alternatives and improvements to the system through evidence-based practices and current risk assessment tools. The Committee was chaired by Justice James W. Hardesty and was comprised of rural and urban judges, public defenders, district attorneys, pretrial services representatives, county representatives, and other stakeholders; and

WHEREAS, the Committee held multiple meetings during which it received presentations from local and national experts on the subject of evidence-based pretrial risk assessment tools. These tools assess the likelihood that a defendant will appear for future court proceedings and the likelihood that a defendant will be a danger to the community if released. Nationwide, courts are moving towards the use of evidence-based risk assessment tools because they guarantee that a pretrial release decision is based on the individual's risk of failure to appear or threat to public safety rather than the individual's ability to pay bail, thus instilling greater fairness and consistency into the process. In Nevada, pretrial release is available for any person charged with a bailable offense "if it appears to the court that it can impose conditions on the person that will

adequately protect the health, safety and welfare of the community and ensure that the person will appear at all times and places ordered by the court." NRS 178.4851(1). Though NRS 178.4853 sets forth factors for the court to consider in determining whether to release a person without bail, there is little uniformity throughout the state in how these pretrial release decisions are made and in what information is available or used in these decisions; and

WHEREAS, on September 1, 2016, the Committee launched a pilot site program using a Nevada-specific risk assessment tool, developed and validated by Dr. James Austin with the JFA Institute, designed to assess a defendant's risk of nonappearance or new criminal behavior. Participating pilot sites included Washoe County District Court, Washoe County Justice Court, Reno Municipal Court, Sparks Municipal Court, Clark County District Court, Las Vegas Justice Court, Las Vegas Municipal Court, and White Pine Justice Court. In addition, courts in Douglas County and Churchill County voluntarily implemented and used the risk assessment tool; and

WHEREAS, on August 15, 2018, based on the results of the pilot program, the Committee unanimously voted to recommend that this court enter an order requiring the use of the validated pretrial release assessment tool statewide; and

WHEREAS, on December 28, 2018, the Committee chair, Justice James W. Hardesty, filed a petition to adopt a statewide requirement that all judges utilize a validated risk assessment tool in pretrial decision-making as recommended by the Committee; and

WHEREAS, this court solicited public comment on the petition, conducted a public hearing on this matter on February 5, 2019, and

considered the Committee's recommendation and the public comment. In particular, the court heard concerns by the Nevada Association of Counties that counties be allowed sufficient latitude in implementing the tool as well as sufficient time to obtain information on potential budgetary and staffing impacts so as to adequately prepare for the implementation of the tool. This court also considered concerns expressed by the American Civil Liberties Union about potential racial bias implicit in the risk assessment tool, and solicited a response from Dr. Austin affirming that there is no current evidence that the tool, which is based on non-racial factors, increases racial disparities in pretrial release decisions; and

WHEREAS, this court finds that the Nevada Pretrial Risk Assessment tool, in the form of both Exhibit A and Exhibit B to this order, has been validated by Dr. Austin of the JFA Institute, and is consistent with that used in other jurisdictions and supported by the Department of Justice; and

WHEREAS, this court has determined that statewide implementation of the Nevada Pretrial Risk Assessment tool is warranted, as it will assist judges in assessing whether a defendant is likely to show up for court and whether the defendant will be a danger to the community if released, it will promote uniformity in how pretrial release decisions are made across the state, and it will ensure that pretrial release decisions are based on the risk posed by the defendant and not by whether the defendant can afford to pay bail;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Nevada Pretrial Risk Assessment contained in Exhibit A and Exhibit B shall be adopted for use in all judicial districts in Nevada.



IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Administrative Office of Courts shall develop training materials for the implementation and use of the Nevada Pretrial Risk Assessment and make those training materials available on the Nevada Appellate Courts' website within 6 months of this order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Administrative Office of Courts shall provide assistance to the judicial districts in educating judicial officers, court staff, and other interested individuals in the use and implementation of the Nevada Pretrial Risk Assessment, with training to be completed within 9 months of this order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Nevada Pretrial Risk Assessment contained in Exhibit A and Exhibit B to this order shall be implemented within 18 months of this order, unless an extension of time is granted by the Administrative Office of Courts upon a showing of good cause.

Since the last report, the JCSN Court Administration Committee met on March 28, 2019.

Allison Lopez and Katherine Brodie from the Department of Public Safety Records, Communications, and Compliance Division gave a presentation on the new Protection Order Program or POP. POP permits the entry of and access to domestic violence protection orders by the courts, thus eliminating the need for courts to fax protection orders to the RCCD.

Vice-Chair March and volunteers are preparing an update of the Model Code of Conduct for Judicial Employees following recent changes by NACM.

Chair Sweet noted that a Spanish translation of victim's rights under Marsy's Law is now available.

There was a discussion of AB411 and the financial, reporting, and timing impact to courts should the bill pass. Committee members also discussed several other bills that could impact the courts. Chair Sweet said that as the almost 400 bills affecting court administration move through both houses in May, volunteers from the Court Administration Committee would start detailed tracking of the bills.

Chair Sweet discussed the rewritten Rules of Civil Procedure and the Nevada-led ICM class, which is planned for August and will be held in Las Vegas.

Since the last JCSN report dated March 5, 2019, the Court Improvement Program (CIP) has focused on three primary strategies: improving timeliness to permanency for children; increasing judicial, attorney, and stakeholder knowledge and expertise; and building systemic capacity through continual quality improvement (CQI) and data exchange.

- CIP and 9 judicial officers from across the state worked for two months with the child welfare agencies and other dependency stakeholders to develop the portion of the Nevada Program Improvement Plan (PIP) that addresses improving timeliness to achieving permanency. The 2018 Child and Family Services Review found Nevada to be out of substantial conformity with all seven outcomes and six of the seven systemic factors assessed. Nevada must submit a PIP to the Children's Bureau by April 22, 2019 to achieve the required improvement on the measurement goals within two years or suffer an estimated penalty of \$1,068,285.00. Four PIP Teams were created to develop the portions of the PIP on four goals:
 - > Strengthen Safety for Children
 - Promote Effective Communication Between Child Welfare and Families

- ➤ Achieve Timely Permanency (CIP co-chaired)
- ➤ Improve Statewide Child Welfare Quality Assurance

Court input was needed (required by the Children's Bureau) to be able to effectively strategize how to achieve timely permanency. When CIP asked for volunteers the following judicial officers stepped-up: Master Okezie, Judge Lu, Master Mierins, Judge Montero, Master Carr, Judge Fairman, Judge Sullivan, Judge Young, and Judge Shirley. The entire Team worked tirelessly within a relentless schedule to achieve an amazing feat – develop a draft PIP document in less than 2 months.

- As a member of the State of Nevada's PIP CORE Team, CIP meets weekly with the Children's Bureau to ensure the PIP development and implementation are
- CIP continued to fully implement and expand the Statewide Juvenile Dependency Mediation Program, JDMP, a joint project between CIP and the Division of Child and Family Services. During the third quarter of the state fiscal year, 71 mediations were ordered across the state with 77% coming to agreement.
- CIP conducted an 8-hour advanced JDMP mediator training on Trauma and Child Protection Mediation: Understanding the Impact on Children, Parents, Caregivers, and Stakeholders.
 Susan Blumenfeld, Director of Training and Technical Assistance for the National Center on Domestic Violence, Trauma, and Mental, developed and conducted the training with the National Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges.
- CIP lead a six-member team to the National State Team Meeting, Washington, DC, where the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Children's Bureau guided states on how to include the Family First Services Prevention Act (FFPSA) in the development the Child and Family Services Plan for the next five years.
- CIP joined a leadership group to design implementation of the FFPSA in Nevada.
- Participated in the meetings of the Nevada Coalition to Prevent Sexual Exploitation of Children, the Nevada Children's Commission, the Indian Child Welfare, the weekly Federal PIP CORE Team, the Judicial Subcommittee for the FFPSA Committee, and the Children's Bureau's weekly NV-CFSR/PIP regularly scheduled meetings.
- CIP held the CIP Select Committee Quarterly Meeting focusing on implementing the Family First Prevention Services Act, the Child and Family Services Review, and development a Program Improvement Plan. Judge Lu updated the Committee on the reorganization of the 2nd JD's Community Improvement Council (CIC), and Judge Stockard apprised the Committee of the focus of the 10th JD's CIC.
- The CIP's Subcommittee on Court Order Templates has finalized drafts of the specialized order templates. A statewide review is planned for July 26.
- CIP attended and participated in Community Improvement Council (CIC) meetings in the majority of the judicial districts throughout the State, providing support and information to assist with the implementation of their annual action plans developed during the 2018 CIC Summit.

- The Specialty Court Funding Committee met on Friday, May 24, 2019, to allocate the available General Funding of \$3M for fiscal year 2020. The allocation awarded to each region and its respective programs was the same as in FY19. II. CALL TO ORDER

Chair, Chief Judge Bell called the meeting to order.

III. APPROVAL OF MEETING SUMMARY FOR MARCH 7, 2019.

Chair, Chief Judge Bell asked members present if they had read the minutes and if they had any changes to them. Judge Cruz motioned to approve the minutes. The motion was seconded by Chief Judge Bell. The meeting summary for March 7, 2019 was approved.

IV. DISCUSSION ITEMS

A. Vexatious/Harassing Litigants

Chair, Chief Judge Bell explained how a vexatious litigant had separate issues in multiple courts and with multiple judges. In dealing with the litigant at the district court it was clear that there was not good communication between courts and our judicial partners about vexatious/harassing litigants. Chief Judge Bell asked council members for ideas how to improve communication. Judge Cruz suggested

having findings made by courts of vexatious litigants, which are public documents, be shared amongst court administrators and the fusion center at least as a start. Chief Judge Bell agreed. Mr. Hlavac indicated the Supreme Court maintains a list of vexatious litigants. Chief Judge Bell expressed concern about whether all courts are notifying and updating the list maintained by the Supreme Court. Chief Judge Bell encouraged members to give this further consideration and tabled the matter so it can be placed on the September 19, 2019 agenda.

B. AB222

Chair, Chief Judge Bell explained that it appears AB 222 will pass. This bill impacts mental health and veterans treatment in specialty courts regarding those who qualify to participate in the programs. Chief Judge Bell indicated that in the district court 75-80 percent of participants would not be able to continue in these programs without the passage of this bill. Chief Judge

Bell asked if there was other legislation that need to be discussed. No other legislation was mentioned.

C. Information on Interpreter

Kandice Townsend indicated that included in the materials is a form provided by Kareen Prentice the Court Interpreter Program Coordinator in the AOC. This form can assist courts in determining the language assistant need in their courts.

- I. Call to Order
 - Judge Goicoechea, as co-chair, unofficially called the meeting to order at 10:08 am.
 - A quorum was not present.
- II. Approval of Previous Meeting Summary
 - Approval of the November 16, 2018 meeting summary was tabled until the next meeting.
- III. Business, Action, and Discussion Items
 - AOC Updates/Reminders
 - Ms. Gradick provided attendees with brief overview of the AOC Grant Program and encouraged attendees to consider applying for grant funds under the FY20 cycle.
 - Attendees briefly discussed what types of project areas qualify for grant funding.
 - ADKT 0539: Order Adopting Statewide Use of Pretrial Risk Assessment
 - ➤ Judge Fortune expressed concern regarding the requirement of the ADKT 0539 order filed March 21, 2019.
 - Attendees discussed resource concerns; many rural courts lack the resources (time,

- staff) to complete the NPRA tool.
- Attendees discussed timelines for implementation. Ms. Gradick informed attendees
 that the AOC is currently developing education per the order's direction. The
 deadline for tool implementation in the courts is 18 months from the March 21, 2019
 order date.
- Attendees discussed the release guidelines that many rural jurisdiction already have in place. Ms. Gradick reminded attendees that the NPRA is only a tool and is not intended to replace judicial discretion in release decisions.
- Attendees discussed rural implantation of the NPRA tool; each jurisdiction will have to take whatever approach works best based on its resources, needs, etc.

• 2019 Legislative Session

- Attendees discussed the status of the following legislation:
 - AB325: Elements rolled into AB125
 - AB81: Heard 5/22, still alive
 - AB411: Did not meet 5/17/19 deadline
 - AB43: Amended; Judge Goicoechea briefly discussed possible local repercussions for Elko County.
 - AB19: Attendees discussed jurisdiction on juvenile matters; justice of the peace can handle these matters in those judicial district where the district court has designated jurisdiction to the justice court. This is the case in Elko County.
- ➤ Ms. Gradick informed attendees that the next deadline is today (May 24, 2019).
- Commission/Committee Updates
 - Ms. Gradick provided a brief overview; many commissions and/or committee have not met recently due to legislative session.
- Community Service Updates
 - > Judge Boatman recently gave a court tour and presentation to local elementary students.
 - > Judge Fortune visited and spoke with students at the local elementary school.
 - ➤ Judge Calton (per Sr. Judge Calton) recently gave a court tour and presentation to local elementary students.
 - ➤ Judge Feasel spoke at the local Booster Club's awards dinner and volunteered with local Girl Scouts troops.
- Informational Documents
 - Attendees were provided with a copy of the AOC Judicial Education Calendar as it appears on the AOC's website.
 - ➤ The AOC had the Victims' Bill of rights translated into Spanish. This was included in the meeting materials and additional copies were made available during the meeting.
- Other Items/Discussion
 - ➤ Judge Fortune asked attendees for input regarding how to proceed when defendants fails to meet fine and/or community service requirements.
 - A suggestion was made to "convert" to jail time for "noncompliance" but be careful
 of how it is phrased.
 - Attendees discussed the option of issuing a warrant if the defendant fails to comply with jail time order.
 - ➤ Judge Fortune asked for input on domestic violence batterer's treatment programs and explained that Argenta Justice Court lacks resources to participate in the LRS online program.
 - Attendees briefly discussed security and monitoring concerns.
 - Attendees discussed compliance; many courts use a "substantial compliance"

standard.

- Attendees discussed payment options; in some instances, the defendant does not earn credit for participation until payment has been made.
- > Judge Feasel informed attendees that the district attorney and public defender have been submitting disks with their motions.
 - Attendees discussed whether these are considered exhibits. Judge Boatman suggested the judge clarify on the record which party wants the disk admitted as evidence.
 - There was a general consensus that the judge should not view the contents of the disks.
- > Judge Boatman asked for clarification regarding search warrant copies and which copy goes to whom.
 - The officer gets the original warrant to execute the search and then returns the warrant back to the court with return of service. The premise behind this is that the court is temporarily placing its authority with the officer in order to execute the search.
 - Defendant receives copies for both the warrant and the affidavit.
 - Stamp the warrant when it is returned and filed with the court.
 - A comment was made that these kinds of procedural topics should be included in the New Judge Orientation workshops.

- Second Judicial District Court
 - o Chief Judge Freeman reported that Judge Tamatha Schreinert was sworn in and is presiding over Department 14, in the Family Division.
 - o He reported that during budget hearings, the County gave them above base funding so they can hire additional court clerks and pre-trial service officers.
 - He reported that Washoe County is doing a national wide search for a new County Manager.
 - o He noted that they are actively lobbying for AB43 and AB46.
 - o He also reported that they are moving forward with the plans for a new courthouse.
- Reno Justice Court
 - o Chief Judge Ryan Sullivan reported that they will be sending out their newsletter that provides an update to courts practices/policy.
 - O She noted that there are remodeling the 1st floor for a more efficient workspace. She reported that after the remodel they will have a meeting room on the 1st floor.
 - She also reported that the job announcement for a Court Administrator will be posted in July.

• Reno Municipal Court

- Judge Tammy Riggs reported that they have graduated defendants from the COD and DUI programs. She noted that the Community Court is in its 8th week and is meeting all its goals.
- o She also reported that she has some concerns with AB125.
- o Mr. Steve Tuttle reported that they received a little more on their base budget which will be used for merit increases.

• Sparks Justice Court

- O Chief Judge Kevin Higgins reported that he received a letter from Lakes Crossing notifying them that they will only do 12 evaluations a year and that Reno Municipal Court gets 7 of the 12. He noted that they are contacting outside vendors to assist in evaluations. Judge Riggs noted they have compiled a list of incompetent people that they could share. She noted that the list may help in reducing costs because if a defendant was a repeat offender and was on the list with a new charge you wouldn't have to get them evaluated. Ms. Bryant reported that Judge Lu is looking for participants for her
- o He reported on Legislation noting that the civil citation bill died and the bail bills are still being heard.
- o Anita Whitehead reported that she is working with Ms. Bryant on calendaring issues.
- O She also reported that at the end of June they will be updating the courts case management system. She noted it is a 2017 upgrade.
