Call to Order, Call of the Roll and Determination of Quorum Status

Chief Justice Douglas, Chair of the Judicial Council of the State of Nevada (JCSN) Full Council, called the meeting to order at 1:32 p.m. A quorum was declared present.

Public Comment

There was no public comment.

Approval of Meeting Summary from the August 31, 2018, meeting

Chair Douglas called for discussion and with there being none, the meeting summary for the August 31, 2018, meeting was approved.

JUDGE MICHAEL VILLANI MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE MEETING SUMMARY OF THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL OF THE STATE OF NEVADA FULL COUNCIL MEETING HELD AUGUST 31, 2018. THE MOTION WAS SECONDED AND PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

Review Bill Draft Requests (BDR) that were previously approved

Justice Gibbons reviewed the bill draft requests that were previously submitted clarifying the role of the Supreme Court in relationship to the bills that were submitted. Justice Gibbons noted that the bills are reviewed by the Judicial Council who makes recommendations to the Supreme Court. The Supreme Court has ten bills that they are invested in and through the Legislature the Supreme Court looks for guidance and leadership on those particular bills. Justice Gibbons reviewed the ten bills seeking any changes to the drafted language.

AB-20 - Revises provisions governing judicial discipline.

Justice Gibbons reported that he had received some communication from some members of the NJLJ indicating that they may want to change some of the language in this bill, specifically issues with some of the terms. Judge Armstrong noted that he is alternate member of the judicial discipline commission and is therefore not aware of any issues with this bill. Mr. John McCormick reported that he has been in communication with Judge Ann Zimmerman, Las Vegas Justice Court and noted that they may prepare an amendment to circulate amongst the limited jurisdiction judges before the bill's initial hearing. He noted that since the bill draft requests are bills now all changes will have to be done via an amendment once the legislative session starts and the bills start being heard.

SB5 – Revises provisions relating to court rules of practice and procedure.

Justice Gibbons reported that this bill will authorize the Supreme Court to adopt rules of criminal procedures. He noted that Justices Douglas and Cherry have worked on the commission for years and once they retire Justice Hardesty will assume Chair of that Commission and Justice Stiglich and Justice-Elect Silver will be joining that committee as co-chairs.

AB43 – Increases the number of district court judges in certain judicial districts.

Justice Gibbons reported that Justice Hardesty is working with the Fourth Judicial District Court on their request for one new judge. He noted that the new position is being supported by the local government and the request is going to be on the agenda for final endorsement at the next Elko County Commissioner's meeting which is scheduled for Wednesday, December 5. Justice Gibbons asked Chief Judges Bell and Freeman for an update regarding their request for new judges.

Chief Judge Freeman reported that they are requesting one new family court judge. He noted that they have met with the county commission manager and that he is in support of the proposal financially. Chief Judge Freeman said, the next step is to go out and speak with each county commissioner before the end of the year and elicit their support.

Chief Judge Bell reported that the initial number of their analysis is what they needed however due to concerns raised by the Supreme Court and by the County they have reduced their request to eight. The breakdown of the eight is seven for the family division as this is the most critical need and one criminal judge who will focus on homicides. She noted that three of the new family court judges will replace existing hearing masters. Chief Judge Bell stated that they plan to meet with the current county commissioners on an individual bases and should be able to report back to the Supreme Court by the end of the year.

Justice Cherry noted that new legislation was submitted for Indigent Defense. He reported that the bill for Indigent Defense was included in Governor Sandoval's budget. Justice Cherry noted that the committee has spent a lot of time crafting the legislation.

Review Revised Judicial Education Procedures

Mr. McCormick reviewed the changes to the judicial education procedures reporting the following:

- Changes the annual required total of continuing education hours for judges from 12 to 13 acknowledging the additional substance abuse mental health credit.
- Requires sitting judges to attend at least one National Judicial College (NJC), National Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges (NCJFCJ), or Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) sponsored course from biannually to quadrennial (once every 4 years instead of every 2).
- It provides carry over credits that match the Continuing Board of Legal Education (CLE). This will allow for greater flexibility for judges.
- It clarifies the attendance requirements for reimbursement that you need to attend at least 75 percent of the conference to get full reimbursement.
- It also updates the matrix that shows the required training to reflect the changes that were made in the recent ADKT 251 Order regarding mandatory Ethics training.

JUDGE TOD YOUNG MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE REVISED JUDICIAL EDUCATION POLICIES AS OUTLINED ABOVE. THE MOTION WAS SECONDED AND PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

Victims' Bill of Rights (Marsy's Law)

Ms. Robin Sweet reported on Marsy's Law noting that within your meeting material is information on Marsy's Law. She noted that he attended a meeting held by the Governor's Finance Office with the Governor's Chief of Staff and several other finance departments to discuss this new law. Ms. Sweet noted there is potential impacts with Parole and Probation (P&P) and Department of Corrections because restitution has to be paid first. She stated that P&P collects a fee for a defendant to be on probation and now that fee has to go to restitution first so there is going to be a huge impact on their budget. Ms. Sweet reported that several court administrators have mentioned that the biggest issue is how they handle restitution noting that some of the restitution goes to the district attorney, city attorney, or P&P so they are going to need proof that restitution has been paid before the fine or payment. She noted that they are encouraging the courts to work with their criminal justice partners to figure out the process.

Chief Judge Bell inquired about the effective date as there has been discussion among the courts in Clark County. Ms. Sweet noted it is a constitution amendment so it is effective immediately.

Justice Stiglich inquired about Victim Information and Notification Everyday (VINE) serving as the platform to include assisting with courts identifying if restitution has been paid. Ms. Sweet reported that

changes to VINE are administrative assessment (AA) funded and Marsy's Law may have an impact on AA fees which may affect any changes made to VINE. Justice Stiglich recommended exploring the use of VINE. Ms. Sweet shared some statistics noting that roughly 80 percent of the misdemeanor are traffic violations that should not have any restitution. She noted that a review of our 30-37 Courts that are using our CourtView system reported they already collect restitution first. Chief Judge Bell noted that this is going to have a significant impact on specialty courts.

Reports of Standing Committees

Court Administration Committee

Ms. Sweet reported on the Court Administration Committee noting that the National Association of Court Managers is revising their Model Code of Conduct so once that has been revised the Court Administration Committee will look to revise their Model Code of Conduct. She reported that the Court Administration Committee will be meeting in a few weeks and they will be discussing Marsy's Law.

Court Improvement Program

Mr. McCormick reported that the Court Improvement Program (CIP) received its federal award amounts for fiscal year 2019. He noted that CIP is continuing the implementation of the juvenile dependency mediation program with funds from the victims of crime grant. Mr. McCormick reported that the Supreme Court has requested a budget enhancement to ensure sustainability of the juvenile dependency mediation program. He informed members that CIP had their annual Community Improvement Council Summit in September and that it was well attended. He reported that the federal government is working on change a few things such as focusing on the prevention rather than removal of the child and they are really pushing to get away from using congregate care.

Judicial Education Committee

Ms. Sweet noted that there is only \$40K left in the elective education budget for the remainder of FY19.

Language Access Committee

Ms. Sweet reported that the language access committee updated the bench cards and courts can be expecting them in January. She noted that the committee is currently working on language access posters for the courts.

Specialty Court Funding Committee

Chair Douglas reported on the specialty court funding committee noting that they had their annual conference in Reno on November 7-9, 2018. Chair Douglas reported that the committee is currently working on reviewing best practices and standards. He noted the next meeting is scheduled for December 14, 2018.

Technology Committee

No meeting to report.

Ad-Hoc Committee Reports

Pre-Trial Release Committee

Douglas, the biggest thing is the request to extend a pilot program as to pre-trial release and I will just say there are cases that are making their way to the Supreme Court as to pre-trial release based upon some of the US Supreme Court or federal district court/appellate court rulings. So we will see how that shakes out.

Reports of Regional Council Meetings

Clark Regional Judicial Council

Chief Judge Bell reported that since 2002 an administrative order has been in place that allows the jail to determine the release of defendants. She stated in order for that to happen the jail has to apply as the order expires. Chief Judge Bell noted that the jail did not apply this year so the court feels there is going to be an impact on pre-trial release. Chief Judge Bell also reported on the gambling court noting that Judge Cheryl Moss is overseeing that court and she has two participants.

North Central Judicial Council

Judge Mike Montero noted that within the meeting materials are reports from the previous two meetings. He said, they had a meeting on November 16, 2018, in Elko and it was well attended.

Sierra Regional Council

Judge Tod Young noted that they didn't have a quorum at one of their meetings but other than that the meetings are well attended.

South Central Regional Council

Judge Steven Dobrescu reported that everything in the South Central Region is going well.

Washoe Regional Council

Chief Judge Freeman reported that the reports are within the meeting materials. He recognized Vicki Elefante for her assistance with the regional meetings noting she coordinates the meetings, attends them and provides the meeting summary.

Informational Materials

Chief Justice Douglas noted that enclosed in the meeting material is the 2018 JCSN roster, 2019 calendar of meetings, Administrative Docket Status Report, and calendar of educational activities.

SUBJECT: Support for Seventh Judicial District Court Resolution

Attached to this memo is a Resolution to support Senate Bill 149 which would assist White Pine County in the construction of a new justice facility in the Seventh Judicial District. White Pine County has some funding but not enough to construct a secure courthouse and sallyport/jail.

The current facility that the District Court is housed in was built in 1906. Ely State Prison is in the Seventh Judicial District and houses the most dangerous and violent inmates in the State of Nevada. Inmates from Ely State Prison are regularly transported to the White Pine County Courthouse for court. In 2003, the Commission on Rural Courts issued a report identifying security flaws due to the age and design of the White Pine Courthouse which negatively affects the ability of the District Judges to ensure a safe and secure environment.

More importantly, the U.S. Marshall Service, in a 2007 facility survey, concluded that the White Pine County Courthouse "should no longer be used for any courthouse related matters".

RECOMMENDATION

JCSN support and approve the Resolution recommending that the Nevada Legislature pass Senate Bill 149 (2019 Legislative Session) which makes an appropriation to assist with the construction of a new judicial facility in White Pine County.

**JUDICIAL COUNCIL OF THE STATE OF NEVADA
RESOLUTION**

WHEREAS, Ely State Prison is the designated maximum security prison for the State of Nevada where the most violent, dangerous inmates in the prison system are incarcerated; and

WHEREAS, 75 percent of the inmates at Ely State Prison are from Clark County, and 17 percent are from Washoe County, Nevada; and

WHEREAS, 6 of the 12 violent murders prosecuted in White Pine County since 2000 occurred at Ely State Prison; and

WHEREAS, 11 of the 19 attempted murders prosecuted in White Pine County since 2000 occurred at Ely State Prison; and

WHEREAS, the District Judges of the Seventh Judicial District of Nevada are charged with presiding over litigation, both civil and criminal, arising out of Ely State Prison; and

WHEREAS, inmates incarcerated at Ely State Prison are regularly transported to the White Pine County Courthouse to make appearances in District Court; and

WHEREAS, the White Pine County Courthouse, built in 1906, has served the citizens of White Pine County for more than one hundred years; and

WHEREAS, in 2003, the Commission on Rural Courts empaneled by the Judicial Council of the State of Nevada issued its Report and identified serious security flaws arising out of the age and design of the White Pine County Courthouse which negatively affects the ability of the District Judges to ensure a safe, secure environment for such prison litigation; and

WHEREAS, in 2003, the Nevada Legislative empaneled the Criminal Justice System in Rural Nevada and Transitional Housing for Released Offenders (S.C.R. 32) Committee

who heard testimony, toured the White Pine County Courthouse, and expressed concern over the security flaws identified in the aged Courthouse, and further expressed concern over the District Judge's ability to safely conduct and preside over prison litigation in the Courthouse; and

WHEREAS, in 2007, the United States Marshals Service conducted a facility survey which concluded in part that the White Pine County Courthouse "should no longer be used for any courthouse related matters either civil or criminal"; and

WHEREAS, the extreme need for a new court facility in White Pine County has clearly been shown; and

WHEREAS, the County of White Pine has partial funding for the construction of a new justice facility; and

WHEREAS, it is widely recognized across the State of Nevada that Judges of the Seventh Judicial District provide a vital service to all of the citizens of Nevada by presiding over cases arising out of Ely State Prison;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved and recommended by the Judicial Council of the State of Nevada that the State of Nevada should recognize the critical need for a new justice facility in White Pine County and should further acknowledge the State's moral responsibility to assist with this critical need;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND RECOMMENDED by the Judicial Council of the State of Nevada that the Nevada Legislature should pass Senate Bill 149 (2019 Legislative Session) and appropriate sufficient monies to assist White Pine County in the construction of a new courthouse facility in White Pine County, Nevada.

The enactment of Marsy's Law on November 27, 2018 prompted a discussion of the various ways the courts furnish notification and collect and provide restitution.

Chair Sweet provided an update to AB 207 (jury information), the DMV new Interlock process, and the 5-day compliance report.

Chair Sweet discussed the Model Code of Conduct for Judicial Branch Employees. Vice-Chair March, Mr. Soderquist, and Ms. Williams agreed to sit on a subcommittee to review the ethics opinion and additions that NACM included in their recent revision.

Chair Sweet noted that 177 bills were dropped by the Legislature already and she reviewed the 10 from the judiciary.

Chair Sweet informed committee members of the dates for ICM Classes scheduled in 2019. She also noted the next NACM conference scheduled for summer 2019 in Las Vegas.

The next meeting is scheduled for March 28, 2019, at 3:00 p.m.

Since the last JCSN report dated November 11, 2018, the Court Improvement Program (CIP) has focused on three primary strategies: improving timeliness to permanency for children; increasing judicial, attorney, and stakeholder knowledge and expertise; and building systemic capacity through continual quality improvement (CQI) and data exchange. CIP:

- Completed, distributed, and explained the Statewide Quality Hearing Study which compared 2014 and 2017 findings. Parental engagement by the judiciary increased significantly over time. The breadth of discussion of discussion during hearings also significantly increased. Additionally, there was a significant increase in oral reasonable effort and Indian Child Welfare Act findings since 2014. The study also identifies best practices that impact outcomes for families and children.
- Continued to fully implement and expand the Statewide Juvenile Dependency Mediation Program, JDMP, a joint project between CIP and the Division of Child and Family Services.

- The Specialty Court Funding Committee met on Friday, December 14, 2018, to allocate the available fee funding of \$5.4M for fiscal year 2020. The allocation awarded to each region and its respective programs was the same as in FY19: the Clark region received (\$3,450,799), the Washoe region received (\$1,034,036), and the Rural region received (\$757,989). II. CALL TO ORDER

Chair, Chief Judge Bell called the meeting to order at 12:00 p.m.

III. APPROVAL OF MEETING SUMMARY FOR MAY 24, 2018.

Chair, Chief Judge Bell asked members present if they had read the minutes and if they had any changes to them. Judge Giuliani motioned to approve the minutes. The motion was seconded by Judge Gibson. The meeting summary for May 24, 2018 was approved.

IV. DISCUSSION ITEMS

A. MAS External Audits

Chair, Chief Judge Bell asked Mr. Jessup to update the members on the MAS external audits. Mr. Jessup referenced the agenda materials and indicated that the State Court Auditor, Staci Anderson wished to remind courts in Group 2 that they were to undergo an external and independent audit during calendar year 2019. The audit report and responses were to be sent to the State Court Auditor's Office. Additionally, members were told of the new FTP server that courts could utilize to transfer documents to the State Court Auditor. Courts should contact the State Court Auditor for username and passwords.

B. Legislative Update

Chair, Chief Judge Bell discussed how courts were meeting regularly to discuss ongoing legislation. Chair, Chief Judge Bell discussed legislation that would add 6 family court judicial positions. Chief Judge Bell asked if there was any additional legislation that should be discussed.

Mr. Jessup indicated that during the Indigent Defense Commission meeting Assembly Bill 81 (AB81) was discussed. Mr. Jessup indicated the AB81 discussed the creation of a permanent Indigent Defense Commission, which would oversee the indigent defense services across the state in consultation with County Commissioners.

Judge Moss asked for clarification on the number of Judges to be added to the Eighth Judicial District Court. Chair, Chief Judge Bell clarified that a total of six family court positions would be added, three for dependency, and three regular family court judges.

C. New Business

Chair, Chief Judge Bell discussed the recent changes to Nevada Rules for Civil Procedure (NRCPP). Chair, Chief Judge Bell indicated that there were challenges with the automatic acceptance and service of documents. Chair, Chief Judge Bell indicated that some documents are not properly being filed and will need to be stricken by the court and refiled. Chair, Chief Judge Bell indicated that the Eighth Judicial District Court cannot comply with the provisions involving service to all parties. This is due to the challenge that some documents are filed under seal and should not be accessible to all parties, including members of the media and other interested parties that can be added to the case.

Judge Moss indicated concern over the accuracy of the data entry on documents filed with the court. Judge Moss indicated that documents were being filed with the wrong caption or title. Chair, Chief Judge Bell indicated the accuracy is a result of the party who files the action incorrectly and if it is improper the court should strike the pleading and have it refiled or corrected. Judge Moss indicated that clerks previously would not accept documents filed improperly. Chair, Chief Judge Bell clarified that the Clerk's Office could no longer reject documents, but

the court could strike improperly filed documents and ask that they be refiled properly.

Chair, Chief Judge Bell asked for the NRCP changes be included on future agenda's.

Chair, Chief Judge Bell asked member present if there was any additional new business needed to be discussed. No new business was proffered.

I. Call to Order

- Judge Montero, as chair, called the meeting to order at 10:10 am and welcomed the attendees.
- A quorum was present.
- Attendees introduced themselves and welcomed incoming members, Jim Loveless and Denise Fortune.

II. Approval of Previous Meeting Summary

- The May 25, 2018 (pending a correction) and August 24, 2018 meeting summaries were approved.

III. Business, Action, and Discussion Items

- AOC Updates/Reminders
 - Ms. Gradick informed attendees that Sheri LeTourneau retired from Judicial Education in July and Leyco Rivas has been promoted to the conference planner position. The new Judicial Education administrative assistant is Anne Marie Mayeaux.
 - For the benefit of the newly-elected members, Ms. Gradick provided a brief overview of the Administrative Office of the Courts and the services/resources it provides.
 - Attendees briefly discussed AOC and court program funding sources; concern was expressed regarding the loss of funding for programs and county revenue should traffic move from criminal to civil.
- Additional Judge for Fourth Judicial District
 - Judge Nancy Porter asked the Council for its formal support of the Nevada Supreme Court's efforts (via bill draft request) to add a third judge to the Forth Judicial District.
 - Judge Porter provided a brief presentation on current workloads in the 4th Judicial District and discussed the need for the additional judge.
 - The local population has increased 109% since the last judge position was added in 1988.
 - Currently, Judge Porter and Judge Kacin are each hearing 30-35 cases a week.
 - The addition and operation of specialty court programs require significant resources and time.
 - The increasing number of self-represented clients requires more work from the bench.
 - New legislation and changes to current laws will require more court resources and time.
 - Currently, the measure has the support of the District Judges Association, the Elko County Bar, and Justice Hardesty has been involved in presentations and discussions on the need for the additional judge.
 - Should the effort be successful, a Committee will be established to address issues of resources and logistics.
 - Attendees briefly discussed the information presented.
 - Defendants are sitting in jail for months as they wait for arraignment.
 - Judges are experiencing decisional exhaustion with such heavy workloads.
 - The public is not being adequately served; this has become an access to justice issue.
 - Some cases are being filed in adjoining counties since the caseloads and wait times are so long in Elko County.
 - The current caseloads in the district court place stress on the justice courts in Elko County as well.
 - Judge Teri Feasel made a motion that, based upon the facts presented, the North Central Regional Judicial Council support the addition of a third district court judge to serve the Fourth Judicial District.
 - Judge Max Bunch seconded the motion.
 - Council members in attendance unanimously approved the motion.
- Bond Exoneration Upon Filing Appeal
 - Judge Feasel asked attendees for input on how to handle bonds if the defendant is convicted and intends to appeal; should the bond be exonerated or sent to the district court?
 - Attendees discussed whether to carry the bond as posted until there is a resolution. A

comment was made that the bond should be exonerated if the appeal has not been filed; there is no guarantee that the defendant will file an appeal just because he/she says he/she intends to do so.

- Attendees discussed the possibility of sending the bond on and letting the district court send it back along with any “guidance” as necessary.
- Commission/Committee Updates
 - Judge Montero provided attendees with a brief overview of the recent Specialty Court Conference in Sparks, NV.
 - Committee to Study Evidence-Based pretrial Release
 - Attendees briefly discussed “Marsy’s Law” and how it will affect pretrial release and bail decisions. Attendees also discussed how to balance a victim’s right to speedy trial with the defendant’s rights.
 - Ms. Gradick informed attendees that the Committee recently submitted a grant for technical assistance to the Arnold Foundation.
 - 2019 Legislative Session Committee
 - Attendees briefly discussed the Nevada Supreme Court bill draft requests (*please see meeting materials for list*); Vicki Elefante, John McCormick, and Ben Graham will be handling the legislative session for the Nevada Supreme Court.
- Informational Documents
 - Attendees were provided with a copy of the AOC Judicial Education Calendar as it appears on the AOC’s website.
- Other Items/Discussion
 - Judge Montero and Ms. Gradick provided the incoming judges with a brief overview of the Judicial Council of the State of Nevada’s structure and purpose.

- AOC Updates
 - Ms. Gradick reminded attendees that the Joint Technology Committee has released two new resources for courts.
 - One resource presents guidelines for dealing with personal information and the second offers tips for increasing a court's online presence and accessibility.
 - An email containing links to these resources was distributed to courts in November; many attendees never received the email. Ms. Gradick will resend this to the group.
 - Ms. Gradick reminded attendees that the AOC distributed a “poster” version of the Victims’ Bill of Rights (Marsy’s Law) for courts to either post in their facilities or distribute to the public as necessary.
 - Attendees discussed the possibility of having this translated into Spanish. The AOC is working on this; Ms. Gradick will distribute it once it is ready.
- Marsy’s Law Discussion
 - Judge Young provided attendees with a brief overview of the Victims’ Bill of Rights (Marsy’s Law) and asked for thoughts/concerns regarding the law.
 - Attendees briefly discussed posting procedures; most courts have posted the notice in the public areas and some are handing out copies to the public as requested.
 - Attendees discussed the restitution demands of the law.
 - Does this mean that P&P cannot collect fees before restitution has been paid? Attendees discussed the proper order of fine/fee collection under the new law.
 - Attendees discussed the impact of this requirement on justice courts and possible impacts to administrative assessment, facility fees collection, etc.
 - Attendees discussed tracking and reporting restitution payments; concern was expressed regarding a lack of uniform, concise procedures for this.
 - Attendees discussed processes for collection; some courts have set-up the case management systems to do this but the function is limited.
 - Attendees discussed jurisdictional concerns and what to do when the court does not have jurisdiction over the case long enough to fully collect.
 - Attendees discussed the need to balance victims’ rights with defendants’ rights.
 - Judge Young suggested the judge weigh both sides, make findings of fact, and put it all on the record.
 - Concern was expressed that the victim’s right to a speedy trial could be used a tool by prosecutors to set an earlier trial date; it may not always stem from the victim’s wishes.
 - A comment was made that victim status is only alleged until adjudication.
 - Attendees questioned whether the court needs to require proof that a victim has been notified and who is responsible for what parts of this process.
 - The district attorney should notify victims of happenings in the case, but does the DA also need to notify the court that the victim has received notice?
 - Attendees discussed potential impact on bail and whether victims must be notified of bail and release decisions as well.
 - How does this affect the NPRA and the Pretrial Risk-Assessment Committee’s work?
 - The NPRA tool was designed to consider public safety so does that already meet the requirements of the law?
- Community Service Reports/Updates

- Ms. Cortes reported that Judge Armstrong gave a presentation at the Brewery Arts Center regarding “Mental Health in the Justice System.” The date was January 8, 2019.
 - Judge Young participated in the China Springs Youth Camp graduation and recently participated in a service club question and answer session.
 - Judge Gregory provided a CLE presentation for NALS.
 - Judge Wilson participated in the Eagle Scout review board.
 - Judge Schlegelmilch and Judge Herrington both participated in Christmas “Parade of Lights” event.
 - Judge Emm-Smith acted as moderator at an Indian Law program event.
 - Judge Vecchiarelli participated in “Career Day” at the local elementary school.

- II. A quorum was not present.
- III. Approval of the February 12, 2018 and June 18, 2018 meeting summaries was tabled for the next meeting.
- IV. Business, Action, and Discussion Items
 - AOC Updates
 - Ms. Gradick introduced Ms. Kareen Prentice, the AOC's Language Access Program Coordinator, and Ms. Shanna Pritchett with the Nevada Supreme Court's Law Library.
 - Ms. Gradick reminded attendees that the Joint Technology Committee has released two new resources for courts.
 - One resource presents guidelines for dealing with personal information and the

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- second offers tips for increasing a court's online presence and accessibility.
 - An email containing links to these resources was distributed to courts in November; please let Ms. Gradick know if you need the links again.
 - Ms. Gradick reminded attendees that the AOC distributed a "poster" version of the Victims' Bill of Rights (Marsy's Law) for courts to either post in their facilities or distribute to the public as necessary.
 - Attendees discussed the possibility of having this translated into Spanish; Ms. Prentice and Ms. Gradick will look into this.
- Informational Documents
 - Attendees were provided with a copy of the judicial education calendar as it appears on the AOC's website.
- Other/Discussion
 - Judge Bishop informed attendees that he has experienced issues with law enforcement citing into other jurisdictions; in some instance, law enforcement is citing into courts/counties that are not even adjacent to the jurisdiction in which the infraction occurs.
 - This continues to happen in the region; attendees briefly discussed statutory authority.
 - A comment was made that not only does this negatively affect the courts but it can also place an undue burden on the defendant.
 - Attendees briefly discussed Nevada Highway Patrol allowing its officers to live outside of the jurisdiction/area to which he/she is assigned.
 - Attendees expressed concern with the new ignition interlock law and discussed various inconsistencies and vague areas in the law.
 - Judge Bishop commented that there is no concise answer as to whether judges should be ordering interlock devices for drug DUIs.
 - Judge Cowley commented that administrative side and criminal side of this law conflict with one another.
 - Attendees expressed concern with the DMV's processes; several times, the DMV has returned orders for various reasons.
 - A comment was made that the DMV is "overstepping" by dictating court actions without considering court obligations, resources, or the court process. The rural courts are particularly vulnerable and lack the resources to "push back" on the DMV.
 - Attendees discussed where to send defendants when there are no interlock vendors close by and whether defendants can be sent out-of-state for a interlock installation.
 - Judge Cowley asked for input on how to handle out-of-state defendants; the court can order an interlock but when the defendant returns home, that state may not enforce the order because it does not require interlocks.
 - Attendees discussed the degree of specificity required for interlock orders; again, the law's language is vague in this area.
 - Judge Cowley asked attendees for input on whether other courts have evaluations and job descriptions for staff and, if so, how often are these updated
 - Most judges use the descriptions and documents available through their respective counties but some have examples they are willing to share if need be.
