- I. Call to order
 - Call of Roll and Determination of a Quorum
 - ➢ Ms. Gradick called Roll.
 - ➤ A quorum was not present.
- II. Public Comment
 - There was no public comment.
- III. Review and Approval of the June 12, 2019 Meeting Summary
 - Senior Justice Cherry, as chair, unilaterally approved the summary from the June 12, 2019 meeting.
- IV. Discussion on the Department of Indigent Defense Services/Board on Indigent Defense Services.
 - Ms. Forsman reported that one position remains vacant. Once the Board is in place, they executive director position will be filled. The Board will accept applications, hold interviews, and recommend three candidates to the Governor for selection.
- V. Caseload Standards Discussion/Update
 - Mr. Jessup presented a brief status update.
 - ▶ His team is continuing to capture information provided by the district courts.
 - Justice and municipal courts do not really report indigent defense data.

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- Self-represented data is being captured but not consistently.
- Attendees discussed whether information should still be gathered if it is incomplete data. Ms. Forsman suggested to keep gathering the statistics for now; Mr. Jessup agreed.
- Senior Justice Cherry commented that the Commission should remain committed to establishing caseload standards.
- VI. Status Update on ACLU of Nevada (*Portions of this discussion were inaudible*)
 - Ms. Forsman reported that the merits discovery process is ongoing and told attendees to expect requests for documents and evidence.
 - Attendees discussed the rural focus of the lawsuit. The lawsuit is against the state with public defenders comprising the class members.
- VII. Status Update on Indigent Defense in Clark County (*Large portions of this discussion were inaudible*)
 - Mr. Christensen provided a brief status update; his office works with newly licensed attorney but needs more experienced lawyers for post-conviction work.
 - Ms. Thomas reported her office negotiated three capital cases in the last month. They have their first 2 cases going to settlement conference soon.
 - Mr. Christensen explained to the committee the process his office went through to figure out the logistics of running a settlement conference.
 - Ms. Thomas reported that, so far, everyone involved in a settlement conference is satisfied. They anticipate three more cases coming.
 - Attendees briefly discussed coercion concerns and settings for settlement conferences.
 - Mr. Imlay reported his office had a case in front of the Supreme Court.
 - Mr. Imlay's office started a new training program for attorneys. His office is working on filling seven positions.
- VIII. Status Update on Indigent Defense in Washoe County
 - Mr. Arrascada provided a brief update.
 - His office has not had any cases appropriate for the settlement conference model but most stakeholder are aware of the option.
 - Washoe County has never carried more than three Category A felonies and is currently handling eight; the county is being supportive.
 - Krista Meier started about a month ago; she is recruiting new lawyers, organizing the processes within the office, and working on clearing work backlog.
- IX. Status Update from the State Public Defender's Office
 - Ms. Kreizenbeck provided a status update.
 - The State office is still in the process of transitioning out from under Health and Human Services; this involves establishing new IT and personnel support.
 - The State office is not opposed to the settlement conference program but has not has cause to utilize it yet.
- X. Status Update on the Federal Public Defender's Office
 - Mr. Kirshbaum introduced himself and provided a brief update.

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- The Federal PD office is continuing with the CLE program offering training on indigent defendants and related issues.
- Attendees briefly discussed the need for training on habeas cases and representing people before the Pardon's Board.
- XI. Update on Eighth Judicial District Court Homicide Case Program
 - No updates
- XII. Other Business
 - Senior Justice Cherry requested Ms. Gradick schedule the meeting for November.
