#### Call to Order

Justice Lidia Stiglich, Chair of the Specialty Court Funding Committee, called the meeting to order at 1:05 p.m. A quorum was declared present.

#### Public comment

There was no Public Comment.

### Approval of the Meeting Summary of the Meeting Held October 11, 2019 at 1:00 p.m.

Chair Stiglich called for discussion, Judge Ellsworth said that there is a clerical correction to the meeting summary in the name change suggestion by Chief Judge Bell. Chair Stiglich called for any additional comments and with there being none the meeting summary was approved with corrections.

JUDGE ARMSTRONG MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE MEETING SUMMARY OF THE SPECIALTY COURT FUNDING COMMITTEE MEETING WITH CORRECTIONS HELD ON OCTOBER 11, 2019. THE MOTION WAS SECONDED BY JUDGE HOLMES AND PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

#### Review of Specialty Court Funding and Expenditures

Mr. Todd Myler reported on the current status of the fee funded account and indicated that there was a small increase in the Administrative Assessment (AA) revenue. Chair Stiglich asked the committee to share their thoughts on how the additional estimated \$400,000 should be spent.

Justice Mark Gibbons suggested pro-rating the increase over all the programs using the State population formula already in place. Chair Stiglich suggested all the teams in the State receive funding for training such as the NADCP conference. Judge Ellsworth expressed that different programs have different funding and spending needs. Judge Ellsworth suggested the money should be distributed pro rata so the courts can use the funding for what's most important for them. Judge Dobrescu suggested the additional funds be distributed pro rata or set aside as emergency funds.

Chair Stiglich asked for additional comments on where and how the non-recurring increase should be used. She provided additional ideas on how the money could be used. Justice Gibbons shared his concerns on the practicality of settling the distribution of the funds in a timely matter. He commented that the individual programs can best determine where the money is spent. Judge Holmes supported Justice Gibbons comments and expanded that the money should be distributed regionally or alternatively given as the same lump sum across the board to each court.

Judge Montero suggested a meeting where all members are together in order to discuss options. Chair Stiglich suggested a meeting to be scheduled that everyone is able to attend in person. Judge Holmes questioned if there is a time limit the funds need to be used by. Mr. Myler responded that the funds need to be used within fiscal year 2021.

Judge Holmes and Judge Dobrescu suggested collectively to submit a proposal of how the funds could be best utilized to be brought in to the in person meeting. Chair Stiglich agreed and instructed the committee members to submit one page proposals on how to spend the one time funding increase by March 6, 2020.

#### Fee Funded Application Allocation Approval

Chair Stiglich called for discussion on the allocation and distribution of the fee funds including an increase of \$192,000. Chair Stiglich brought the Committee's attention to the graduation rate percentages that have also been included on the report. Judge Cruz expressed her concern as to some of the drug courts showing a graduation rate of 100%. Judge Cruz expanded on this stating

not all courts have the same funding, programs, and participant count which are all factors for the overall graduation rate.

Justice Stiglich agreed and included recidivism as another influence on graduation rates. Mr. James Popovich shared with the Committee the Second Judicial District's efforts on tracking recidivism and the results. Judge Holmes stated that recidivism needs to be better defined. Justice Stiglich and Mr. Popovich will work together on the recidivism issue. Judge Lu shared with the Committee that the Best Standards and Practices document does have it defined but the document has not been voted on for approval yet.

Judge Dobrescu suggested the \$5.4 million dollar allocation be the same as the prior year's allocation and the use of the remaining \$192,000 & \$400,000 be decided at the next meeting.

JUDGE DOBRESCU MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE 5.4 MILLION DOLLAR ALLOCATION IN FISCAL YEAR 2021 TO BE THE SAME ALLOCATION GIVEN IN FISCAL YEAR 2020. SECONDED BY JUDGE MONTERO AND PASSED.

#### Name Change for Committee

Mr. McCormick presented the proposal made by members of this Committee to change the name to Specialty Court Funding and Policy Committee

JUDGE ELLSWORTH MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE NAME CHANGE TO SPECIALTY COURT FUNDING AND POLICY COMMITTEE AS SHOWN IN THE BYLAWS. SECONDED BY JUDGE CRUZ AND PASSED.

#### Best Standards and Practices and Peer Review Progress

Judge Dobrescu shared with the Committee that the final draft of the Standards and Best Practices document (please see meeting materials for additional details) is now available. Judge Dobrescu questioned the committee if this should be tabled until a discussion regarding recidivism has been completed. Chair Stiglich agreed and asked for any additional comments on the draft the Subcommittee presented, hearing none Chair Stiglich requested Ms. Aguire to add the recidivism discussion to the next agenda.

Chair Stiglich asked for an update on progress in developing a Peer Review Program. Judge Dobrescu shared the framework for the Peer Review process is already in place, and that we are waiting on the approval of the Best Standards and Practices document in order to continue.

#### *Informational/Future Discussions*

### **Specialty Court Conferences**

Ms. Aguire informed the Committee that the Nevada Specialty Court conference will be on October 14<sup>th</sup>-16<sup>th</sup>, 2020, at the Aliante Hotel in Las Vegas. Many of the speakers have been finalized and the agenda is currently being worked on.

NADCP 2020 is being held in Anaheim and rooms are already fully booked so attendees will need to find other accommodations.

#### **General Fund Report**

Ms. Aguire presented the current results for the second quarter showing that 60 percent of the general funds currently are left. Ms. Aguire reported she has been in contact with the courts showing higher percentages remaining, and stated they all do have a plan for using their remaining funds.

#### DCCM Statistics Second Quarter

Ms. Aguire presented the statistical report comparing fiscal year 2019 to fiscal year 2020. It shows an increase in active cases and in parents regaining custody of children. A decrease is shown in drug free babies and active cases in DUI courts. Ms. Aguire reminded the committee that the courts need to make sure the information is entered in DCCM for reporting accuracy.

#### Call to Order

Justice Lidia Stiglich, Chair of the Specialty Court Funding Committee, called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m. A quorum was declared present.

#### Public comment

There was no public comment.

#### Creation of Statewide Coordinator Position in the Specialty Court Funding Account-1495:

Justice Stiglich commented that the Supreme Court supports the creation of the Statewide Specialty Court Coordinator. She opened the discussion with a request for comments on the proposed position of Statewide Coordinator that was shared to the members of the Committee.

The discussion began with the questions of funding the position and if it would have a direct effect on the programs receiving fee funded allocations. After significant discussion there was a consensus that the Specialty Court Program needs someone with a higher level of experience in specialty courts to support the courts and their programs.

JUDGE HOLMES MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE NEW SPECIALTY COURT STATEWIDE COORDINATOR POSTION WITH THE ADDITION TO THE JOB DESCRIPTION AND JOB CLASSIFICATION THAT THE CANDIDATE TO HAVE ADDITIONAL EXPERIENCE WITH DRUG COURTS. THE MOTION WAS SECONDED BY JUDGE MONTERO. THE MEMBERSHIP WAS POLLED AND PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

#### Funding Decision

Justice Stiglich requested information from the Committee how their courts were doing and if they are going to be using all their funding through the rest of the fiscal year. She inquired as to if the pandemic is pushing the number of participants down or impacting the services being provided.

Judge Ellsworth shared that the 8<sup>th</sup> JDC is not accepting any new people at this time and asked DeNeese Parker to comment on how much of the funding would be spent for the remainder of the year. Ms. Parker stated that the only court that is having difficulty is their Felony DUI since the people in the court are now mostly unemployed and they are required to pay for their treatment. She also commented that the majority of her courts are spending all their money and most are spending more than what is received from the AOC because the treatment is costing more now because group sizes are smaller and that incurs a higher cost.

Justice Stiglich thanked Ms. Parker for her information and stated that at this time the needs of the courts have changed. The courts must now rely on additional internet software, telehealth, and other creative ways of treating the participants.

Judge Letizia commented her Court's numbers went up, but now they cannot go to counseling so they are working on new ways to treat as well.

Judge Montero commented that his Family Court Program was displaced due to the facility now being used for Covid-19 patients. They are using Zoom counseling.

### Impact of AB236 Implementation and Impact

Justice Stiglich asked if there is an impact from AB236 in the programs. Judge Dobrescu stated that there is because P&P is doing its graduated assessments and it is taking months to get people into the program. Judge Montero stated that in his court with P&P being a part of the Drug Court has helped by moving people quicker.

#### Potential of Withholding Fourth Quarter distributions:

Justice Stiglich shared that she wants to make sure everyone is spending their General Funds. She asked the members that if they have courts that are not going to spend their allotments please contact the AOC so we can transfer the funds directly to other courts that need the funding instead of taking the fourth quarter and having to return and resent.

**SUBJECT:** Projected Specialty Court funding for Fiscal Year 2021

The COVID-19 shutdown has had a significant effect on all state revenue sources, including Administrative Assessments and Specialty Court Assessments. Attached is a current projected Specialty Court budget based on the Legislatively Approved Budget for Fiscal Year 2021, along with estimated declines in Administrative Assessment and Specialty Court Assessment revenues that have been shared with the Governor's Finance Office. Any material changes in revenue that could affect the program, will be communicated to the Committee as soon as practicable. The following are highlights from the projected FY 21 budget:

- 1) General Fund for distribution (line 12) = \$3,000,000
- 2) Projected Fee Funding available for distribution (line 13) = \$4,550,000
- 3) Specialty Court Coordinator (Line 14) = \$154,569
- 4) Non-Recurring Fee Funding Supplement (line 15) = \$0
- 5) Year-end balance to carry forward to FY 22 (line 23) = \$1,572,097

#### Fee Funding Decline

The above Fee Funding amounts are contingent upon the Administrative Assessments coming in at the projected amounts, and Bond Forfeiture revenues coming in at their budgeted levels (see lines 5, 6 & 8). This estimate results in a decline in available Fee Funding of approximately \$850,000. This also assumes there will be no reversion of General Funds, which is a change from the previous report to the February 7, 2020 meeting. As those projected reverted funds were given by the Legislature in order to ensure sufficient reserves, it seemed appropriate to incorporate those funds into the available distribution, yet still maintain reserves at a reasonable level.

Also of note, I have removed the Non-Recurring Fee Funding Supplement of \$400,000 as that would have reduced the funds available for distribution beyond the \$850,000 reduction mentioned above.

Specialty Court Funding & Policy Committee Page 2 April 14, 2020

As NADCP has gone to a virtual format, the estimated Team Training expenditures for Fiscal Year 2020 have been reduced to \$35,000, rather than the planned \$46,964, since there will be no travel costs associated with this conference.

#### Specialty Court Coordinator

The Committee approved the creation of the Specialty Court Coordinator position in this budget at the emergency meeting on April 3, 2020. Justice Stiglich's ballpark estimate of \$150,000 mentioned during that meeting was pretty close to reality, as the estimated payroll costs for salary and fringe come to \$154,569 for Fiscal Year 2021. The position is slated to begin working on May 4, 2020. There are no travel, training, nor operational expenses included in the budget for this position at this time.


#### **Conclusions**

This projection also assumes no reversion of General Funds in Fiscal Year 2020. Reverted Fiscal Year 2020 funds would not likely affect Fiscal Year 2021; however, it should be noted that funding for the next biennium may then be scrutinized by the Legislature and adjusted in the budget process if they determine that the same General Fund level is not needed.

As the Committee approved allocation of \$5.4 million in Fee Funding for distribution in Fiscal Year 2021 during its meeting of February 7, 2020, and amended distribution in the amount of \$4,550,000 will need to be considered at this meeting.

#### A. Recidivism means:

A conviction for a new crime reported to NCIC (National Crime Information Center) within 3 years of successful completion of a program.

#### B. Recidivism means:

A conviction for a new crime reported to NCIC (National Crime Information Center) within 3 years of successful completion of a program.

As used in this definition "crime" includes all drug or alcohol related offenses, DUI's, felonies and gross misdemeanors. The term "crime" does not include minor traffic offenses.

#### C. Recidivism means:

An arrest for a new crime reported to NCIC (National Crime Information Center) within 3 years of successful completion of a program.


