"Security required by a court for release of a prisoner who must appear at a future time" -Black's Law Dictionary


What Is Bail?

- 1. Person arrested.
- 2. Surety deposits security with court.
- 3. Person released.
- 4. Person complies with court orders and case resolved.
- 5. Court releases security.



The Commercial Bail Transaction

- 1. Person arrested, family goes to bail agent for help.
- Bail agent, on behalf of insurance company, underwrites transaction. If risk accepted, bail agent takes bond to jail/court.
- 3. Person is released and
 - Complies with court orders, case completed, bond exonerated.
 - Does not comply with court orders—things get complicated.

Why Is the Business of Bail Regulated?

- To protect policyholders
- To provide adequate standards of solidity, integrity, competence in conduct of affairs
- To ensure fair and equitable treatment
- To ensure adequate and healthy market with competitive conditions and exercise of initiative
- To prevent misleading, unfair, and monopolistic practices

Division's Role

Commissioner implements and enforces provisions imposed on businesses related to bail under NRS 697. This covers

- Licensing
- Duties and limitations of each license type
- Trade practices
- Claims handling
- Penalties for violations

Court & Law Enforcement Roles

Court

Law Enforcement

- Exonerate/declare forfeited bonds
- Hold proper party responsible for paying bond
- Ensure bail agents and bail enforcement agents are not abusing their authority
- Register bail agents
- Receive notice of apprehensions
- Ensure bail agents and bail enforcement agents are not abusing their authority

How the Business of Bail Works

The business of bail aligns with the license types that exist:

- Insurance company NRS 680A.060 (NRS 681A.070)
- Bail agent NRS 697.040
- Bail enforcement agent 697.055
- Bail solicitor 697.060
- General agent 697.070
- Bail agency, bail enforcement agency, general agency NRS 697.100

NRS 697.090—License Required

"A person in this state shall not act in the capacity of a bail agent, bail enforcement agent or bail solicitor, or perform any of the functions, duties or powers prescribed for a bail agent, bail enforcement agent or bail solicitor under the provisions of this chapter, unless that person is qualified and licensed as provided in this chapter."

Duties Tie Back to License Type

- Bail agent represents insurance company and underwrites bond—determines level of risk and decides if insurer will accept the risk, holds collateral for insurer; holds power of attorney to execute bonds on behalf of insurer.
- Bail solicitor solicits bail transactions for employer (BA).
- Bail enforcement agent enforces the terms of release from custody, locates a defendant, and apprehends or surrenders defendant to custody.
- General agent supervises or manages bail business written by BA on behalf of insurer.

Common Issues with Bail Regulation

- Unlicensed activity
- Contracts that violate Nevada law
- Charges—premium, fees, expenses
- Collateral
- Early surrenders
- Misuse of information
- Misrepresentation/misuse of authority

Compare Licensing Requirements

Bail Agent

Appointed by surety

- Competent, trustworthy, financially responsible
- Complete 6 hours of training in bail bonds
- Take/pass exam

Bail Enforcement Agent

- Complete high school
- Trustworthy, competent
- Psychological exam/drug test
- Complete 80 hours of training in law, field operations, skills, and principles of investigations
- Take/pass exam

NRS 178.526 Arrest of defendant.

- 1. For the purpose of surrendering a defendant, a surety, at any time before the surety is finally discharged, and at any place within this State, may, by:
- (a) Written authorization for the arrest of the defendant attached to a copy of the undertaking; or
- (b) A written authority endorsed on a certified copy of the undertaking, cause the defendant to be arrested by a bail agent or bail enforcement agent who is licensed pursuant to
- hapter 697 of NRS.
- A bail agent or bail enforcement agent who arrests a defendant in this State or any other jurisdiction is not acting for or on behalf of this State or any of its political subdivisions.

NRS 697.325 Notice to local law enforcement agency when defendant apprehended; notice to local law enforcement agency before forcible entrance of inhabited dwelling; penalty.

- 1. After apprehending a defendant in this state, a bail agent or bail enforcement agent shall mmediately or without undue delay notify in person or by telephone the local law enforcement agency of the risdiction in which the defendant was apprehended of:
 - (a) The identity of the defendant;
 - (b) The identity of the bail agent or bail enforcement agent; and
- (c) Where the bail agent or bail enforcement agent is taking the defendant to surrender the defendant
- Before forcibly entering an inhabited dwelling in this state, a bail agent or bail enforcement agent shall notify the local law enforcement agency of the jurisdiction in which the dwelling is located.
