# **Highlights**

### **Community Improvement Councils**

Nevada Court Improvement Program's (CIP) principal initiative to help courts reduce barriers to timely permanency for children in need has been to support the Community Improvement Councils (CIC) in each judicial district. The CIP Coordinator attended and participated in CIC meetings and trainings in all 10 of the Judicial Districts (JD). Three quarterly CIC newsletters have been distributed to help inform CICs about what each CIC is doing to accomplish its goals and objectives.

In 2010, each of the State's ten judicial districts created a CIC that focused on identifying barriers to timely permanent placement of children at risk. The CICs have been regularly meeting in their communities and at annual Summits where they have learned to interpret data specific to their districts, while creating strategies to reduce the amount of time that it takes to move cases involving children at risk through the court process. The overriding focus, in addition to the safety of the child, is to create an environment where the best decisions are made for each child.

The CICs have been so impactful that the time it takes for the courts to return children to their homes or find safe, permanent placements has been significantly reduced and now stands below the national average. For example, in its 2013 Annual Progress and Services Report, the Division of Child and Family Services (DCFS) reported that the median length of time it took for a child to be adopted in Nevada in 2012 was reduced to 30.7 months down from 36.3 months in 2010. Nevada courts and child welfare agencies have now outpaced the national median, which is 32.4 months.

The CICs have become important information conduits between agencies within and among courts. All CICs have been trained in the new SAFE (Washoe and Rural Counties) or SIPS (Clark County) child welfare practice models. The DCFS asked CIP's and the CICs' input into developing their Federal Child and Family Services Plan (CFSP - 5 year strategic plan). Each CIC received statewide statistics on outcome and indicator performance and systemic factors, as well as their local CY 2013 court timeliness measures and FFY 2013 permanency composite scores from which they could choose to develop measurable objectives to be included in the CFSP.

In preparation for the CIC Summit, October 2 and 3, 2014, the National Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges (NCJFCJ) surveyed the CIC team members to identify possible topics and measure the impact the previous Summits have had on the judicial districts. The majority of the respondents (80%) expressed a desire to focus on quality hearing practices with a close second (63%) interested in strategies to improve timeliness and time to permanency.

Due to this strong interest in the principles of quality hearings, CIP submitted an application to the National Resource Center for Legal and Judicial Issues for technical assistance to undertake a quality hearing practice project. NCJFCJ will be conducting court observations and constructing baseline data for each of the courts for use at the CIC Summit.

## Data Exchange

The key to the CICs' success is to keep them fully and regularly informed about the progress they are making by providing them with their own data in a useable format. To that end, one of CIP's data exchange projects, the Centralized Case Index, will enable near real-time court timeliness reporting through an integrated dashboard.

As part of the CIP continual quality improvement efforts, in 2013 CIP embarked on a mission to provide a consolidated view of critical information from a court case management system (CMS) and UNITY (the statewide dependency and neglect CMS). A proof-of-concept (POC) system has been developed that combines information from the  $2^{nd}$  Judicial District Court's CMS and UNITY. This POC was designed to prove that:

- Case and case party information from multiple sources can be combined into a single data store and provide a consolidated view of case information;
- Timeliness reports can be generated on-demand through a browser based system and presented to the user in an easily understandable format.

Since the POC successfully accomplished both of these objectives; CIP is moving these capabilities into a fully productionalized system, the Centralized Case Index.

Not only will judges eventually be able to obtain aggregate data reports in dashboard-like format, they will be able to drill down to get case specific information. The intention is to provide a continuous feedback loop to the courts and CICs on how they are doing to help them determine where they may wish to focus additional efforts.

### **Statewide Collaborative on Education**

The Policy and Planning Group of Nevada's Collaborative on Education has implemented the majority of the first phase of its strategic plan. A protocol to ensure students remain enrolled in their same school, if in their best interests, has been drafted. A best interest decision-making process has been created. The Nevada Department of Education has provided each school district with guidance concerning the definition of "awaiting permanent placement". Federal funding streams are being explored to assist with school transportation costs.

A checklist has been drafted for child welfare and the school that identifies the specific action steps needed for foster youth to be immediately enrolled in a new school and to begin classes promptly. The homeless liaisons in the schools are serving as the schools' foster child advocates, as well. A pilot project is being developed in one of the school districts in which child welfare will be able to directly inform the schools when a child becomes a foster child or a foster child moves into their district or a new school. This model, if successful, will be replicated throughout the state eventually.

A joint letter from the Nevada Division of Child and Family Services and the Nevada Department of Education on the Uninterrupted Scholars Act of 2013, similar to that which the federal Secretaries of Health and Human Services and Department of Education sent to the states, has been drafted and is awaiting signatures. This letter directs schools and child welfare to share information about foster children. It also verifies that it is the position of both agencies that the ACT applies to all children in the legal custody of a child welfare agency.

A Data Subcommittee was convened to identify educational data elements currently available, where the information is located, and its strengths and weaknesses. The pilot project mentioned above will help address data accessibility, as well.

## **Dependency Mediation**

As part of the CIP continual quality improvement efforts, the NCJFCJ completed a process evaluation of dependency mediation in the  $5^{th}JD$  and an outcome evaluation of the dependency mediation program in the  $2^{nd}JD$ . The results of the process evaluation demonstrate that the dependency mediation program in the  $5^{th}JD$  has had a successful start. Although only 10 mediations have been held, all ten have resolved with agreements. There is a general perception from both parents and stakeholders that mediation is a helpful tool to move cases forward. Parents felt that they were listened to, their opinions were respected, and that they were part of the decision-making process. The stakeholders found mediation increased parental engagement and provided an alternative to litigation while not increasing their workload.

Key findings from the  $2^{nd}$  JD's assessment indicate that mediated cases are more likely to result in reunification of the children with their families when compared to non-mediated cases (88% to 50% reunified). Findings show that fathers who participated in mediation were more engaged and were present at more hearings compared to fathers who did not participate in mediation (72% to 50%).

Mediation expanded into the western, rural judicial districts (3<sup>rd</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> JDs) and the Washoe Tribe held three successful dependency mediations. The 9<sup>th</sup> JD has asked their court's Family Mediation Services to mediate dependency cases as well.

## Court Order Guides

The court order template project has been CIP's primary initiative to help court's improve their processing. The National Center for State Courts has been working with a statewide collaborative to create dependency court order templates which the courts may use as guides to ensure inclusion of appropriate language for judicial determinations regarding contrary to the welfare of the child, reasonable efforts to prevent removal, and reasonable efforts to finalize the permanency plan.

Several members of the CIP Select Committee and the Nevada judiciary have provided the consultant guidance. As a result, 9 court order templates were developed; one for the 72 hour hearing and two for each of the remaining dependency hearings (one in which the Indian Child Welfare Act (ICWA) did and one in which ICWA did not apply). The Collaborative is in the process of a final review before releasing them statewide to be used as guides by those courts wishing to do so.

**Narrative:** *Description of status of project as related to the outcome upon onset of funding.* The CIP Select Committee approved a policy that only evidence-based best practices supporting CIC action plans would be funded using CIP grant funds.
