Court Improvement Program Strategic Plan

Highlights

Community Improvement Councils

Nevada Court Improvement Program's (CIP) principal initiative to help courts reduce barriers to timely permanency for children in need and enhance hearing quality has been to support the Community Improvement Councils (CIC) in each judicial district. The CIP Coordinator attended and participated in CIC meetings and trainings in all 11 of the Judicial Districts (JD). Quarterly CIC newsletters have been distributed to help inform CICs about what each CIC is doing to accomplish its goals and objectives.

In 2010, each of the State's judicial districts created a CIC that focused on identifying barriers to timely permanent placement of children at risk. The CICs have been regularly meeting in their communities and at annual Summits where they have learned to interpret data specific to their districts, while creating strategies to reduce the amount of time that it takes to move cases involving children at risk through the court process. The overriding focus, in addition to the safety of the child, is to create an environment where the best decisions are made for each child.

The CICs have been so impactful that the time it takes for the courts to return children to their homes or find safe, permanent placements has been significantly reduced and now stands below the national average. For example, in its 2013 Annual Progress and Services Report (APSR), the Division of Child and Family Services (DCFS) reported that the median length of time it took for a child to be adopted in Nevada in 2012 was reduced to 30.7 months down from 36.3 months in 2010. In its 2014 APSR, DCFS reported that the median months to adoption in Nevada as of April 1, 2014 was down to 29.0 months which is once again lower than the national median of 32.4 months. For the second year, Nevada courts and child welfare agencies outpaced the national median.

The purpose of the CICs has expanded to include improving court case processing, adherence to the AFSA and NRS timelines, child safety decision making, and the quality of court hearings. Additionally, the CICs inform the development and implementation of the CIP Strategic Plan. CIP provides the judiciary and their CICs with judicial district specific baseline and follow-up data which enables them to self-assess their improvement and progress and determine where additional efforts are needed.

In preparation for the Annual CIC Summit, September 30 through October 2, 2015, the CIC judicial leaders were surveyed to identify possible topics and measure the impact the previous Summits have had on the judicial districts. The majority of the respondents expressed a desire to focus on specific strategies for quality hearings with an emphasis on current hearing practices or projects in Nevada Judicial Districts.

During the Summits the teams are not only trained on specific topics, but work together to develop action plans outlining next steps to improve court case processing and court timeliness for the upcoming year. Additionally, the teams share and learn from each other as it is only by educating the judiciary and their CICs that continual quality improvement will be effectuated throughout the State. The initial assessment of the 2014 CIC Summit included participant reaction and degree of learning. One hundred percent (100%) of the participants believed the Summit information would be useful to

their daily work, and effectively met their needs in terms of better understanding the importance of quality hearings and what exactly quality hearings involve. The degree of learning was determined by measuring increased knowledge of the subject matter, as well as questions concerning what outcome is likely to improve as a result of applying the information learned. For example, only 57% of the participants felt they were either knowledgeable or very knowledgeable about quality hearings principles before attending the Summit; whereas over 92% felt they were knowledgeable or very knowledgeable about quality hearing principles after the Summit.

Data Exchange

The key to the CICs' success is to keep them fully and regularly informed about the progress they are making by providing them with their own data in a useable format. To that end, one of CIP's data exchange projects, the Centralized Case Index, will enable near real-time court timeliness reporting through an integrated dashboard.

As part of the CIP continual quality improvement efforts, in 2013 CIP embarked on a mission to provide a consolidated view of critical information from a court case management system (CMS) and UNITY (the statewide dependency and neglect CMS). A proof-of-concept (POC) system has been developed that combines information from the 2nd Judicial District Court's CMS and UNITY. This POC was designed to prove that:

- Case and case party information from multiple sources can be combined into a single data store and provide a consolidated view of case information;
- Timeliness reports can be generated on-demand through a browser based system and presented to the user in an easily understandable format.

Since the POC successfully accomplished both of these objectives; CIP is moving these capabilities into a fully productionalized system, the Centralized Case Index.

Not only will judges eventually be able to obtain aggregate data reports in dashboard-like format, they will be able to drill down to get case specific information. The intention is to provide a continuous feedback loop to the courts and CICs on how they are doing to help them determine where they may wish to focus additional efforts.

Statewide Collaborative on Education

The Policy and Planning Group of Nevada's Collaborative on Education has implemented the majority of the first phase of its strategic plan. A protocol to ensure students remain enrolled in their same school, if in their best interests, has been drafted. A best interest decision-making process has been created. The Nevada Department of Education has provided each school district with guidance concerning the definition of "awaiting permanent placement". Federal funding streams are being explored to assist with school transportation costs.

A checklist has been drafted for child welfare and the school that identifies the specific action steps needed for foster youth to be immediately enrolled in a new school and to begin classes promptly. The homeless liaisons in the schools are serving as the schools' foster child advocates, as well. A pilot project is being developed in one of the school districts in which child welfare will be able to directly inform the schools when a child becomes a foster child or a foster child moves into their district or a new school. Another educational pilot project provides foster youths in Washoe County high schools with educational champions who provide educational supports for foster youths to help guide

and motivate them to graduate and continue some form of secondary education. Both these models, if successful, can be replicated throughout the state.

A joint letter from the Nevada Division of Child and Family Services and the Nevada Department of Education on the Uninterrupted Scholars Act of 2013, similar to that which the federal Secretaries of Health and Human Services and Department of Education sent to the states, has been drafted and is awaiting signatures. This letter directs schools and child welfare to share information about foster children. It also verifies that it is the position of both agencies that the Act applies to all children in the legal custody of a child welfare agency.

A Data Subcommittee was convened to identify educational data elements currently available, where the information is located, and its strengths and weaknesses. The pilot project mentioned above will help address data accessibility, as well.

The Blue Ribbon for Kids Commission

The Blue Ribbon for Kids Commission was convened to identify where systemic barriers to best practices in the overarching child welfare system exist and recommend how to overcome these barriers.

On March 27, 2015, the final recommendations report from the *Blue Ribbon for Kids Commission* were presented to the public. The recommendations include:

- I. Improve Reasonable Efforts and Child Safety and Removal Decision-Making
- II. Reform of the Child Welfare Agency Process
- III. Reform of the Court Process
- IV. Ensure Meaningful Representation and Voice in the Process from the Initiation of Proceedings
- V. Selection, Retention, Training, and Ongoing Professional Development for all Stakeholders
- VI. Improve Public Education about the System
- VII. Collaboration for Systemic Overarching Reform

This report is the first step in an ongoing strategic planning and reform process that will provide a comprehensive strategy for realizing the goal of a child-centered, self-improving, and sustainable child welfare system to support our most vulnerable children and families. The next phases will include action planning and implementing each of the recommendations with technical assistance from the U.S. Department of Justice's Office of Justice Programs' Diagnostic Center.

<u>The Statewide Coalition to Prevent Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children</u>

A statewide action plan to prevent sex trafficking of children has been drafted to develop and implement a trauma-informed, victim-centered approach to combat the commercial sexual exploitation of children. A Statewide Coalition to Prevent Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children is being formed. Task forces will be created to address each focus in the action plan.
