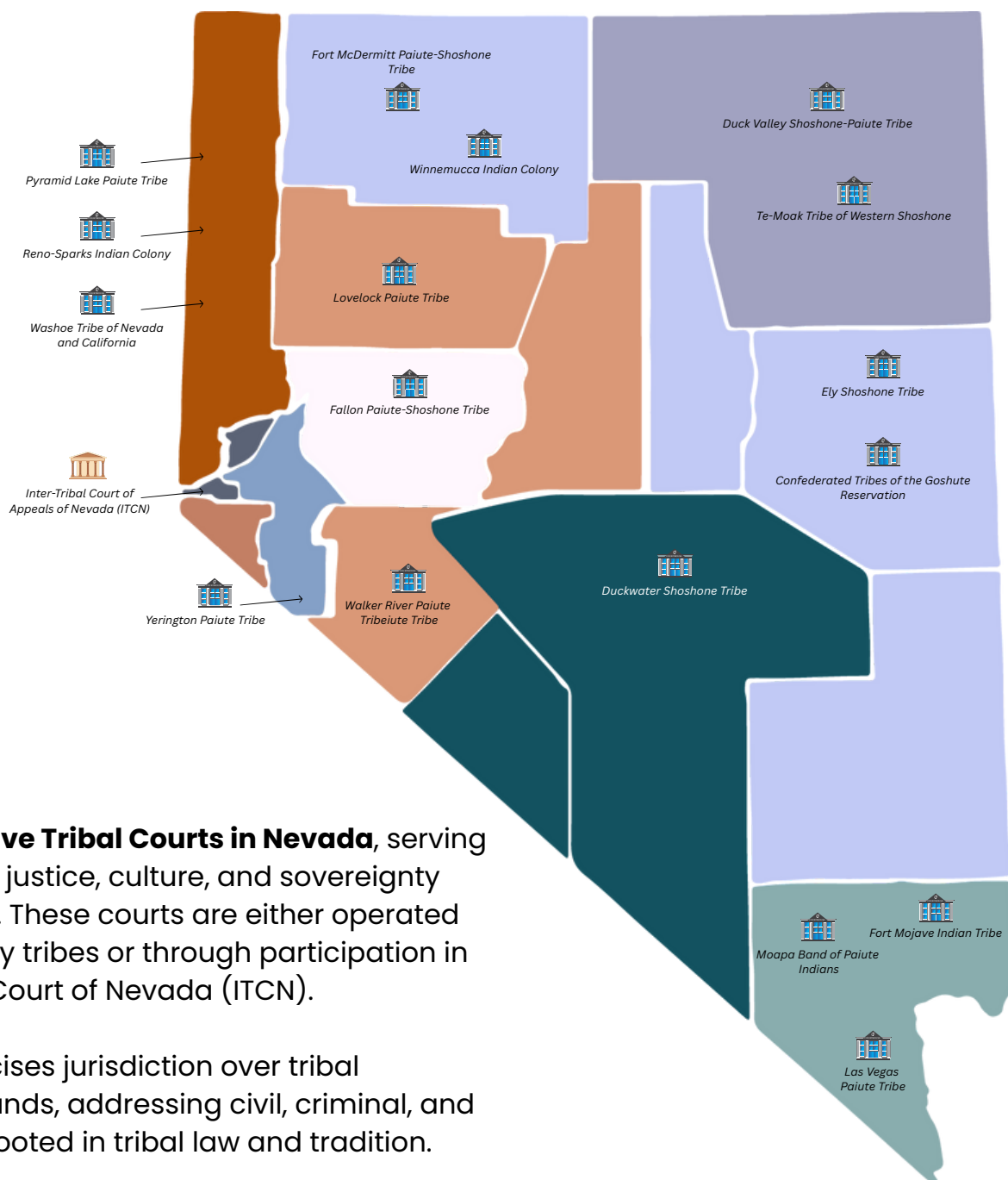

Reference for identifying tribes, jurisdiction, and courts in Nevada



There are **18 active Tribal Courts in Nevada**, serving as institutions of justice, culture, and sovereignty across the state. These courts are either operated independently by tribes or through participation in the Inter-Tribal Court of Nevada (ITCN).

Each court exercises jurisdiction over tribal members and lands, addressing civil, criminal, and family matters rooted in tribal law and tradition.
